4. ⁷Fearful art thou (O Lord our guide)

That in thy presence may abide,
If once thine anger kindled be?
⁸Thou makest men from heaven to hear,
Thy judgements just: the earth for fear

5. ⁹When thou, O Lord, beginnest to rise,
Sentence to give, as judge of all,
And in the earth dost enterprise
To rid the humble out of thrall.
¹⁰Certes,³² the rage of mortal men,
Shall be thy praise: the remnant then
Of their fury thou blindest with all.
6. ¹¹Vow, and perform your vows therefore
Unto the Lord your God, all ye:
That round about him dwell: adore
This fearful one with offerings free.
¹²Which may cut off at his vintage
The breath of princes in their rage:
To earthly kings fearful is he.
