## SOUTH LEITH PARISH CHURCH CELEBRATES 500 YEARS

(ERECTED 1483)

# CANDLEMAS SERVICE SUNDAY, 6th FEBRUARY 1983 at 11 a.m.



### A Word of Explanation

Candlemas came to be celebrated forty days after Christmas, but it is even more ancient than Christmas. It was observed in the Eastern Church to recall the Presentation of Jesus as a child in the temple at Jerusalem, a festival of Christ, "The meeting of the Lord" (i.e. with Simeon and Anna). The Western or Roman Church thought of it as the occasion of the Purification of the Virgin Mary, referring to the Jewish custom of the purification of women after childbirth. Eventually great numbers of candles or lights came to be used, making the point that Jesus Christ is the Light of the world. So it became, in common usage, Candlemas.

Today South Leith Parish Church is reviving this ancient tradition of the church to remind ourselves that our role is still the same as that of the kirk's founders 500 years ago: to show Jesus Christ to be the light of Leith and the world. Five hundred candles will be used, the majority of them having been made by the Church's Kirkgate Youth Club. Their light will symbolise the meaning of Christ's coming to a world that without Him lies in spiritual darkness. At the same time we will see signified the unfailing witness to the light of Christ maintained here for five centuries.

## ORDER OF SERVICE

### INTIMATIONS AND APOSTOLIC GREETING

INTROIT: "O send thy light forth and thy truth" (From Psalm 43: Martyrs)

### FOUR RED CANDLES ON THE COMMUNION TABLE ARE LIT IN TURN

1. The first is lit to remind us that God wills light for the world:

"In the beginning of creation, when God made heaven and earth, the earth was without form and void, with darkness . . . . God said, 'Let there be light', and there was light; and God saw that the light was good . . . "

(Genesis 1)

2. The second candle is lit to remind us of the light fanned by the prophets when life was dark:

"The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light: light has dawned upon them, dwellers in a land as dark as death . . . . Then shall blind men's eyes be opened, and the ears of the deal unstopped . . . "

(Isaiah 9 & 35)

3. The third candle is lit to remind us of John the Baptist, who called men and women to change their way of living and prepare for the man Jesus:

'The light shines on in the dark, and the darkness has never mastered it. There appeared a man named John sent from God; he came as a witness to testily to the light, that all might become believers through him . . . The real light which enlightens every man was even then coming into the world."

(John 1)

4. The fourth candle is lit to remind us of Mary, who was ready to respond gladly to God's call, and who proclaimed His concern for the humble:

"Here am I, I am the Lord's servant; as you have spoken, so be it . . . . . . . so wonderfully has He dealt with me, the Lord, the Mighty One. His name is Holy; His mercy sure from generation to generation toward those who fear him . . . . "

(Luke 1)
